

Chinese Brush Painting - Journey to the West (Monkey) Part 1

Explore your first (or a deeper) taste of the art of the Chinese Brush with Paul, (& for Part 2, Claire Seaton as well) who between them bring 50 years of Chinese brush painting experience. This summer school, we will use the fabulous Chinese story of the 'Journey to the West' (or the Monkey King) as a base to explore the fascinating art of China and beyond. Working toward the principles of Chinese Brush will give us plenty of opportunity to explore this classical text and the fascinating subjects within it. Please note: Students may wish to enrol on either or both courses as 'Part 2' follows on naturally from Part 1. Alternatively, each course is accessible as stand alone. If you wish to enrol on both courses as a resident please contact us to discuss options for Wednesday evening.

Description

Both, or either, of these courses will introduce the art of Chinese Brush Painting to those who have not explored this medium before as well as building more in-depth knowledge for those already studying and who wish to focus on Chinese Brush Painting in more detail.

Journey to The West, Part 1 (Monday - Wednesday) taught by Paul

Day 1 of this course will allow students to explore:

Session 1: Landscape - Mountains and rocks

Session 2: Characters from the story: Tripitaka & maybe Pigsy and Sandy

Day 2 will focus on applying techniques learnt on Day 1:

Session 3: Characters from the story: Water Dragon

Session 4: Characters from the story: Horse

Day 3 will focus on applying techniques learnt on Day 1 and 2:

Session 5: Characters from the story: Demons

Session 6: Bringing it all together

The days begin traditionally with 20 minutes of optional qigong (gentle breathing exercises to settle the mind). Teaching is carried out with a step-by-step approach where the fundamentals of a subject are fully explained. This will include the Calligraphic basis for individual strokes. Students are encouraged to work from sketches of subjects and to use these observations in their own compositions.

Students will come to understand the essence of subjects in Chinese Brush Painting through tutor demonstrations, and by observation and practice, and leave understanding how to complete a series of Chinese Brush Paintings.
