This course is suitable for all levels, from beginners to the experienced. A wide range of laces are available and can be catered for, including Bucks and point ground, Torchon, Binche, Flanders and Idrija. The aim is to tailor the course to the individual and is an ideal course to those new to or returning to lace. For those new to the discipline instruction will be given using a project which covers the basic techniques. The more experienced lacemaker will have the opportunity to expand their knowledge and skills in technique, design, and interpretation.

Description

English and continental laces cover a wide range, Bucks and point ground, Torchon, Binche, Flanders and Idrija. Others may be available, please contact the tutor. The wide range of laces available means the course will be tailored to each participant. For those new to lace, instruction will be given via a pattern, aimed at developing the knowledge and skills of the core techniques. For those with some experience this is the ideal opportunity to work on a specific aspect, for example a new project, a different technique, consolidating previous learning or designing a new pattern.
