

Introduction to Silver Jewellery Making Machi De Waard

10th - 11th Aug 2017
Thursday to Friday

Learn the techniques of piercing, shaping, filing, hammering, soldering and finishing as you make a simple silver ring, then try out different texturing methods with a second piece of jewellery. No experience or artistic skills are necessary. You will be given instruction in the use of tools and equipment as the course progresses. Students can choose to work either in silver or they can work in copper. Silver is not included in the course cost.

Description

This course aims to teach students the basic principles of jewellery making. You will start by learning how to use the basic tools required to make jewellery, such as the piercing saw, benchpeg, pliers, hammers, mandrels and torch. The first project, a ring, will guide you through the fundamental techniques of jewellery making, such as piercing, shaping, filing, sanding, hammering, soldering and finishing. Once your first project is completed, we will expand into texturing techniques using hammers and the rolling mill. We will discuss how to design and plan your second project and depending on what you make, we will cover other techniques of jewellery making. You will leave with at least two finished pieces of jewellery in either copper or silver. The tutor can advise you on further courses to take if you would like to continue making jewellery. The silver for the first ring project will be £4. The silver for the second project will either be £15 for a pendant, £8 for a ring, or £10 for a bangle. Time permitting, you may make another project. The tutor will have a limited amount of silver available to buy for extra projects. Please be advised the materials can only be paid for with cash, cheques cannot be accepted.
